Music, dance, food and performance art due at University Park

From 6 to 10 p.m. Saturday, the streets of Akron's University Park neighborhood will come alive with a magical display of lantern lights, music, dance, performance art, food and fun.

Presented by the University Park Business Association in cooperation with Leandra Drumm Designs, the theme of the free, family-friendly event is *The Garden of Earthly Delights*.

Squeals begin at 6 p.m. at Don Drumm Studios and Gallery, 437 Crouse St., with an exhibit by installation artists Dan Coffield and Kevin Smalley. A lantern procession will wind its way through University Park to end in a serenade of, uhhh, bagpipes and an authentic hurdy-gurdy.

Other entertainment also will preside, including visual and theatrical performances, dance performances featuring artist Lisa Lock, a stilt walker, free henna tattoos and more artists, musicians and dancers.

Crazy outfits and lanterns are encouraged. Lantern-making workshops have been held throughout University Park and on the University of Akron campus in preparation for the event.
